

As suspected the heavy equipment working on the boat ramp ruined it beyond repair. The good news is we now have a new boat ramp with a much better slope and easier access. Hopefully by the end of next weekend, the ramps will be installed and everything will be completed to put the Boat Club back in full operation.

A word of warning the ramp is slicker than the old one, even though it has deeper scores in it. It has been suggested that, it is because of the ramp being new concrete, which should go away over time.
