All boat and boat trailers must have current registration, license, US Recreational Fee Tags, CF numbers, and boat must have a Membership number decal on the starboard rear of the transom. In addition the trailer must have a Membership number decal on the right rear fender, or if the trailer has no fenders then behind the right rear wheels, either of these options shall be placed so as to provide clear visibility to a passing with the member can place his number decal on the right (passenger side) rear window of the tow vehicle.pedestrian. Alternately or in combination

with the member can place his number decal on the right (passenger side) rear window of the tow vehicle.

The good members need to police the not so good, and if members see any of these or any other violations, please come to the Board meetings and report them. Ideally the Board would need two such reports about the same violation to be able to take action against the scofflaws. Without the support of the members nothing can be done. ### Striper's Threatened

I am leaving this in from last month in the hope that we can get some members to send letters and attend the DFG meeting in February. This is a very important matter that could have devastating results on the striper population.

Following is the First Paragraph of the Water4Fish website (<a href="http://water4fish.org/striper/">http://water4fish.org/striper/</a>)

"In an unprecedented move, the California Department of Fish and Game has been forced to propose regulations which will eradicate striped bass from the San Francisco Bay and Delta. A water contractor group known as the Coalition for a Sustainable Delta filed a lawsuit against the DFG alleging that striped bass are one of the primary causes of the loss of endangered salmon. The DFG was forced into a settlement on the lawsuit and the Department now has issued draft regulations that will eradicate the striped bass. Fisherman and the fishing industry are livid about the proposal. It will reduce the minimum size a fisherman can keep to 12 inches and it will allow a bag limit of up to 40 stripers in some locations."

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
